Hebrews 1:1 Jewish Christians experiencing persecution and discouragement. (FBSE, page 1804)

20 points. Application Question. What is the main theme of Hebrews?

Hebrews 1:1 That Jesus is a better priest or mediator between God and people than were the Old Testament priests. (FBSE, page 1805 and JBQ #303)

10 points. Application Question. Used thirteen times, what is the key word of Hebrews?

Hebrews 1:1 Better (FBSE, page 1805)

10 points. Application Question. Over how many names or titles for Jesus are found in Hebrews?

Hebrews 1:1 Twenty (FBSE, page 1805)

10 points. Application Question. Two-part answer. What has Jesus done to the Old Covenant?

Hebrews 1:1 Fulfilled; replaced. (FBSE, page 1804)

10 points. Application Question. Statement and question. The Book of Hebrews shows that Jesus established a New Covenant. What is a covenant?

Hebrews 1:1 A life agreement. (FBSE, page 1804)

Hebrews 1:1 Forsaking their faith in Jesus Christ.

Reverting to relying on Jewish practices and customs. (*FBSE, page 1804*)

Hebrews 1:1 The Anointed One of God (*JBQ #331*)

By suffering he became worthy to pay the full penalty of sin for all people.

Hebrews 2:1-3 Take seriously the warning to not neglect our relationship with God.

Develop our relationship with God by time in the Word and in prayer.

Accept the guidance of His Spirit within us. (*FBSE, page 1808*)

20 points. Application Question. From Hebrew chapter 3. How do we harden our hearts?

Hebrews 3:8 If we ignore his voice from within us, our hearts will grow hard and unresponsive until they are no longer sensitive to God’s Word or the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

Hebrews 3:13 Deceitfulness (*FBSE, page 1811*)

1 Peter 1:1 Separation, submission, and suffering for Christ. (*FBSE, page 1848*)

1 Peter 2:24 Removed our guilt and the punishment for our sins, opening the way by which we can return to God and receive a right relationship with him. *(FBSE, page 1857)*

1 Peter 3:10 Lives full of God' blessing and favor.
God's special attention and presence.
God's answer to their prayers. (*FBSE, page 1858*)

20 points. Application Question. What is symbolized by water baptism?

1 Peter 3:21 The death of the old sinful nature and a new life in Christ. (*JBQ # 434*)

20 points. Application Question. What is the purpose of water baptism?

1 Peter 3:21 It is our public confession and pledge that we belong to Christ and have identified with his death in that we have now died to sin's control and influence. (*FBSE, page 1862*)

1 Peter The outward threat from surrounding society.

2 Peter The inward threat from compromise from within the church by false teachers.

2 Peter 1:18 On the Mount of Transfiguration. *(FBSE, page 1869)*

2 Peter 2:14 Constantly lusting, that is, entertaining a strong sensual desire for another, whom one views only as a sexual object. *(FBSE, page 1871)*

2 Peter 3:12 Committing themselves to spreading his message throughout the whole world
Eagerly demonstrate a desire for his return by praying, "Come, Lord Jesus."

10 points. Application Question. What is the reason for the Lord's seeming delay in returning for his people?

2 Peter 3:9 His great patience and compassion, no wanting any to perish. (*FBSE, page 1872*)
